1. Defibrillator

The Patient Participation Group (PPG) is pleased to announce that a Defibrillator has been purchased and is now in situ within the Surgery.

2. Weekend & Bank Holiday GP Service

Weekend GP appointments are now available in Southend. All patients registered with a Southend GP practice will be able to use this service, with appointments available at Southend Medical Centre (01702 333298). Appointments from North Shoeburyness Surgery (01702 297976) will be available to book from Saturday 23 December 2017. The service offers access to a GP between 10am and 3pm. Appointments need to be pre-booked via the surgery, but they can be booked on the same day.

The service is being delivered by a local GP federation, GP Healthcare Alliance.

Patients should still call 111 outside surgery hours and medical emergencies should dial 999.

3. Flu Vaccination

Children who are aged 2, 3 and 4 years old on 1st September 2017 - Children in this age group would be entitled to the intranasal flu vaccination administered as a 'puffer' up the nose.

Adults – We are nearing the end of our flu vaccination season, if you have not had your vaccination and are aged 65 and over or in one of the at-risk categories, please contact the surgery to book your flu vaccination appointment as soon as possible

4. Pneumonia Vaccinations

Patients over the age of 65 years or in the risk group categories and wish to have the vaccination should contact the surgery.

5. DNA Appointments

The surgery is still experiencing Patients not attending their appointments.

It would be most appreciated if you would contact the surgery if you are unable to keep the appointment so that the slot can be allocated to someone else.

6. Online Access

Please contact the surgery if you wish to have online access to booking doctor appointment, repeat prescription requests and / or view detailed coded records.

7. Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Meetings are held four times a year, nominally of 2 hour duration and are used to identify:-

I. How the surgery is operating.
